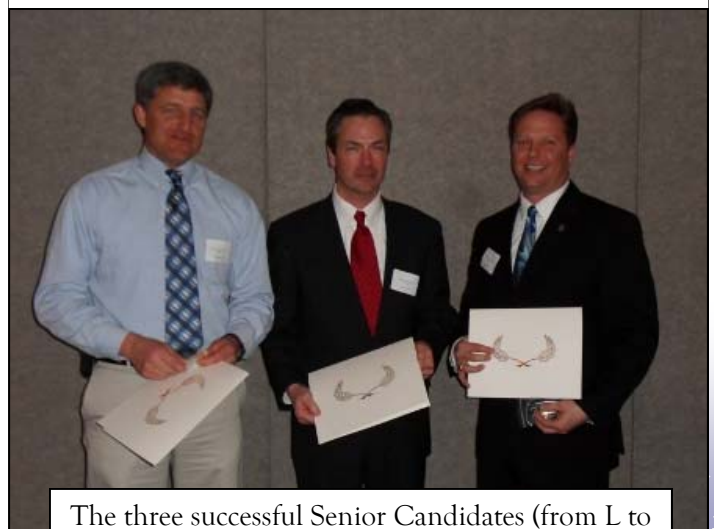

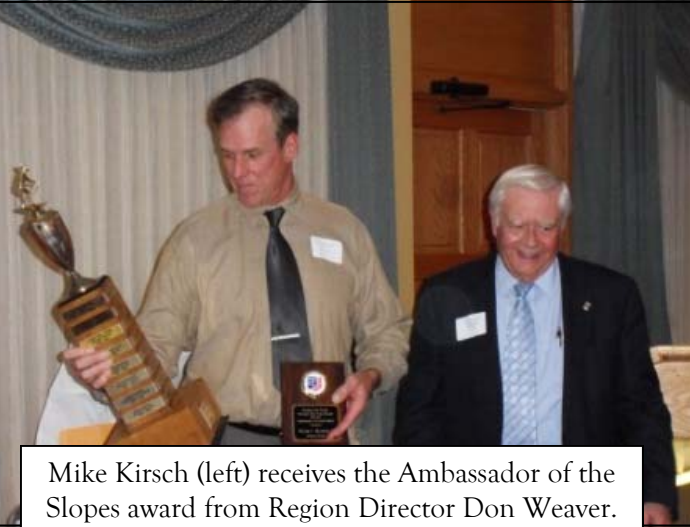

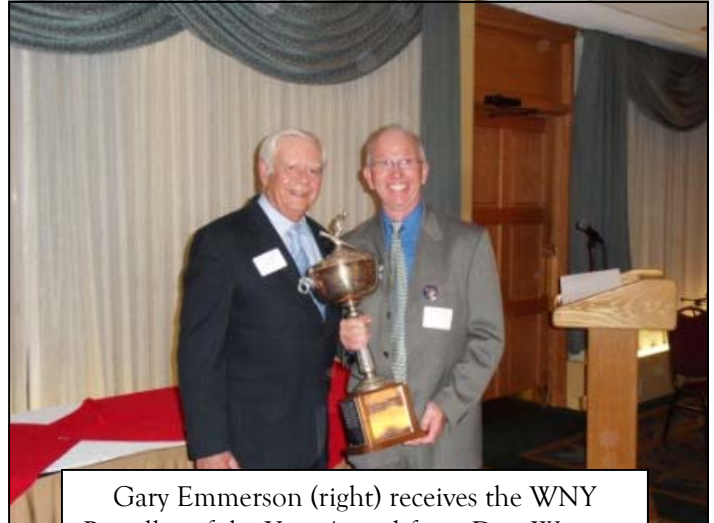

Platform Statement of Joseph "Butch" MacQueen for Position of Region Director

In approaching the varied themes of my platform, I want to begin by mentioning that much of the region, the patrols and programs are functioning very well due to the dedication of many excellent people, especially the leadership of Don Weaver, our outgoing RD. I do not think there are any major problems on the region level that need an immediate "fix." Instead we need to continue to serve the needs of the patrols and patrollers of the region.

The region programs of Outdoor Emergency Care, Ski & Toboggan, Instructor Development, Mountain Travel & Rescue, Avalanche, etc. are functioning well. Having served for many years as an advisor and

supervisor for some of these programs, I understand that as problems do arise in these venues, it is important that they are dealt with in timely manner and in a way that is fair to all concerned. This year, the introduction of the new OEC text has created some major changes that will be felt by every patroller. At the time of this writing, it appears that this introduction is being very well organized from the National office down to our region. The changes in the OEC program should be very positive if all proceeds as planned.

If elected, I would hope to visit all patrols in the region at least once during each year. There have been major strides made to bring all the patrols in the region onto a "level playing field" with regard to having access to programs. I feel this impetus must continue. We are a region of eight competent patrols, each made up of many extremely dedicated people. The region will function best when we share our most valuable resources, excellent people with varied talents who form strong patrols.

We have experienced a rebuilding of the National Ski Patrol over the last eight years. Eight years ago we saw an erosion of the pride in being a member of the National Ski Patrol. Most of us had known the pride we felt in being a member of a very prestigious organization. This was particularly frustrating to those of us who had served the organization for decades at the local, region and division levels. Today I feel much of that pride has been restored, especially at the local and region level. The continued growth of this pride would be one of my top priorities.

The Region Director of Western New York Region will sit on the Eastern Division Board of Directors. Our region has become one of the recognized leaders of the division. If I can serve as your Region Director, I would take this responsibility very seriously. You perform your duties for your area management. Many of you work tirelessly within and outside your patrol on the various programs that enhance all patrollers. I have had many enjoyable hours meeting patrollers from around the region and division while instructing in many NSP courses. I value each of

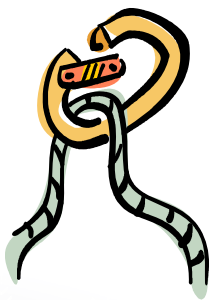
News from Holiday Valley by Bert Probst

There's a very interesting article by Erin Francis, a Western NY skier, in the summer issue of Ski Patrol Magazine (originally in the Winter 2010 edition of *The Fall Line*). Erin covers an incident in which, as a 16 year old, she fractured both a tibia and fibula. The injury required four hours of surgery and involved a plate and six pins. The entire article focuses on the Kissing Bridge

patroller that cared for Erin on the hill, in the patrol room and follow-up visits in the hospital. This caring and proficient patroller really made a deep impression on Erin. So much so that after full recovery she was motivated to start training for the patrol and she now patrols at the Buffalo Ski Club. Who was this caring patroller who made such a strong impression? She was Barb Wein, a long time patroller in the Western NY region and frequent visitor to the Valley. Sadly, Barb is no longer with us; however, she is remembered with great respect. She was not only a caring and

competent patroller but she also lent her expertise in adaptive skiing by often helping with lessons in our



Lounsbury Adaptive Ski Program. The bottom line here is that Barb provided the fine example of a caring patroller and motivated a young girl to join the patrol. I'm sure Barb never thought she was doing anything extra special; just doing her duty. A great example of how our smallest acts of kindness can have such far reaching effects.

No matter what your position is on the use of helmet be sure to read the letter to the editor, page 6, in the summer issue of Ski Patrol Magazine from one Bud Harrigan of the Bromley ski patrol in Vermont. Mr. Harrigan presents an entirely new view on the issue which deserves consideration and dissemination to the general public. He points out that helmets can be of only marginal value in preventing injury. He suggests the money spent on a helmet might be more effective in making you safer on the hill if it were put towards a top notch ski lesson or new boots or updated bindings. Each of these suggestions would help you ski more under control and therefore enhance your safety. Worth considering! Also on the subject of helmets, on page 15 it is reported that New Jersey has passed a law requiring minors (under 18) to wear a helmet while skiing or snowboarding. Illinois legislators defeated a similar proposal while California and New York have helmet laws under consideration.

Marshall Cohen, Respected Holiday Valley Patroller

The Western New York Region lost one of its most respected patrollers this past December with the passing of Marshall Cohen, National #4403, and a 48 year member of the National Ski Patrol.

Marshall grew up in Milwaukee, WI where he was an outstanding high school football player. As an 18 year old, he made a decision that would be typical of Marshall the rest of his life. He turned down a full ride football scholarship to Marquette, choosing instead to go to the University of Wisconsin where he could get a degree in Electrical Engineering.

He started his patrol career at Glenwood Acres in 1961, and became part of the Kissing Bridge Patrol when it annexed Glenwood.

I first met Marshall in 1963 while I was running a Ski Fair and Marshall was in charge of the Ski Patrol booth. I instantly was impressed with his straight forward manner and his quiet competence. We became good friends for almost 50 years.

In 1971, Marshall joined the Holiday Valley Patrol and skied 38 years with us until health issues forced his retirement in 2009. Marshall earned his Senior status in 1973 and his National number #4403 in 1974.

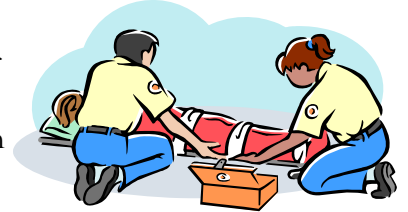
About 10 years ago, he suspected his skiing skills were diminishing, so in his mid 60's, after 40 years of patrolling, he joined our senior candidates' S & T training program. This meant skiing his two required patrol shifts, plus two more shifts for S & T, and re-qualified at the S & T Senior level.

Marshall's wife Beverly was a ski instructor at Kissing Bridge and the two of them passed on their love of skiing to their four sons; one lives at Sun Valley, one at Breckenridge, one lives in the Bronx and skis New England, and one lives in Cleveland and skis with us at Holiday Valley. We'll all miss Marshall and his

many contributions to patrolling, but we'll never forget him.

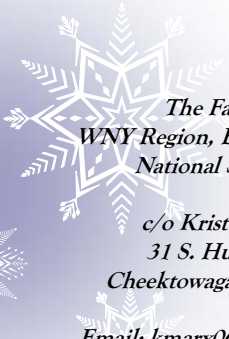

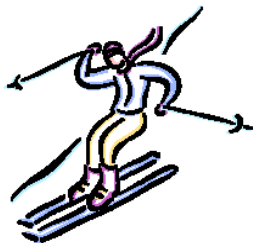
